Two months ago you wrote inquiring about the "Robertson papers" with the view they contained information concerning ex-Governor Roland Hill Hartley. I informed you then that the "Robertson papers" I was familiar with were not extensive. So far as I know, that is the case here.

However I have encountered a small book, What Price Politics, the inside story of Washington State Politics, by Maude Sweetman, White & Hitchcock Corporation, Seattle.

This is undoubtedly in the University of Washington Library, but perhaps the Hartley references therein are not cross-indexed.

I have not read it, but note on scanning on pg. 25 "The 1925 Struggle" "...Governor Roland Hartley for more than a quarter of a century has been a person of importance in the lumber industry, etc."

Perhaps Miss (?) Mrs(?) Sweetman is still living, or left papers.

And while not along this line, but that of "Indians," a manuscript of some 55,000 words I have written for the Yakima Indian Nation is now at the printers and will be issued around Jan. 6. This will be a paper back and not expensive book, illustrated. If you will keep in mind this publication, I will send you some information sheets on it when a price has been set, probably around \$2.25 a copy, for distribution to a few friends of yours who may be interested in that field.

In the unusual event the University does not have the small book I mentioned (it was published in 1927, let me know and I will place it on "inter-library" loan to a library you designate, with the provision you may "withdraw" it for a period of a month or longer.
