- (b) To give financial, educational, medical and religious assistance to the Navajo Indians; to advance all causes; plans and projects which may directly or indirectly benefit the Navajo Indians.
- (c) To alleviate poverty, suffering, disease, illiteracy and distress among the Navajo Indians; to solicit, accept and distribute funds and property to aid and assist the Navajo Indians; to do all things necessary to carry out the purpose of this corporation.
