## DIGEST OF THE OBJECT AND MEMBERSHIP OF THE STATE CAPITOL HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION OF WASHINGTON

## OBJECTIVES

The object of the State Historical Association is to collect books, maps, charts, papers, relics, and all material illustrative of the history of the State, and in particular, the progress and development of the Territory of Washington. Therefore, the objectives are historical, cultural and educational.

We accept loans and gifts, from any one, of articles which have a bearing on the above interests, and we give these loans and gifts the care and protection afforded by the other buildings and departments upon the State Capitol Grounds, of which our building occupies a part. We have Highway and Police patrol on the grounds. We cannot, however, offer the promise that no emergency might arise, any more than one can forsee such exigencies. However, we can place our exhibits on display in safe cases and have safety devices thereon for protection. The Museum is more fire-proof than most structures of this nature in other cities.

We also accept archival and research materials, scrapbook clippings, old Territorial newspapers, family histories and biographical sketches, diaries, information about places of any historical interest, forts, buildings, events pertaining to your localities, anecdotes (based upon historical and other communal facts), transportation, industries, and old Territorial directories. Unusual facts about the beginnings and the incorporation of Territorial towns are most welcome.

## MEMBERSHIP

Anyone who is a citizen of the United States or its Territories may join the Association.

We have three voting memberships. These are scaled to meet personal budgets and varying places of residence, giving a wide choice.

- 1 Active Membership: Two dollars (\$2.00) yearly dues.
- 2 Sustaining Membership: Five dollars (\$5.00) yearly dues.
- 3 Life Membership: Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) minimum at present.

  This membership may be raised at a later period.

  No yearly dues with this membership.

ENDOWMENT MEMBERSHIP: Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)
No yearly dues.

Single memberships may be obtained in the above categories by the individual members of the organization, even though the organization has its own membership.
