Dear Cull:

During the rush of letter writing and the Old Man's death, I've misplaced your letter regarding the Drummer and Dreamer tour to Ephrata on October 19. That is a Friday. We will come to Ephrata from Pasco-Richland, breaking away from there about 4 p.m. and coming to Ephrata that evening (October 19.)

I wish I had known about the book store or gift shop possibility and could have had some imprints made for you. However Mrs. Cull could write to the publisher, requesting "withdrawal" of 10, or 15 books in connection with a "small appearance" on the morning of October 19. It should be noted these would be returnable. I will bring along some extras with me in case she should run short. Or, it may be that she would want to, with the approval of the historical society, handle them that night. She can do it any way.

In connection with the night appearance at the PUD auditorium, I am enclosing some blank invitations. The blank space should read: Grant County PUD Auditorium, (time) , sponsored by Grant County Historical Society. I am also enclosing \$3 which should be sufficient to pay for a print shop to set the imprint on there. If it is more, I will pay the difference. And if the society does not have mailing facilities, such as postage, I will refund that. I have to hold these invitations to about 100 to 200 depending upon the size of the town.

But perhaps you will have means of distributing them otherwise and by working with Herb Jenkins and Ken Crow, can get out plenty of them. If you want to you could keep out some and just write in the book store appearance, say 10:30 to noon, and send out ones for that.

Be sure in writing to the publisher: Caxton Printers, Ltd., Caldwell, Idaho, that this is just a small appearance and that these are being withdrawn for that purpose.

Your store (wife's) would receive a 40 per cent discount on the books.

I've got all the tour outlined and preparations made but for Ephrata, so I'm sorry all this comes late, and when I'm getting jammed with other things. But I think with a little push, the Society can get out a good attendance. We won't have a Buffalo Bill wild west show, but as a curator of the Washington State Historical Society and with the Indians backing me up, we can give a talk, a little drumming and some sacred chants and get the people acquainted with the Indians.

I will want time at the evening to take recognition of the PUD for their friendship of the Indians. These things you can work out with Ken and Herb Jenkins. We will wish to present books to our friends of the PUD, and take public recognition of their friendship.

You should receive the blanks in the same mail. I am sending them separately.

Thanks for your assistance. We will try and make it an historical occasion, truly.
