

- A RAGE TO LIVE by John O'Hara. Novel. Over a million copies in print of this frank, honest, sometimes shocking novel by the author of TEN NORTH FREDERICK. Now F1963 reissued to take advantage of the publicity which is accompanying the publication of O'Hara's latest and biggest novel, FROM THE TERRACE, already being acclaimed as a sure-fire bestseller. - A1885 THE MARTIAN CHRONICLES by Ray Bradbury. Science-Fiction. Ray Bradbury is the biggest name in science-fiction -- and THE MARTIAN CHRONICLES, a collection of imaginative and beautifully-written stories about man's first interplanetary adventures, is considered a classic by science-fiction fans. Almost half-a-million copies in New introduction by Clifton Fadiman. (Reissue)
- A1898 SO MANY DOORS by Oakley Hall. Novel. This sensual novel of the bulldozer drivers working on the California roads, is the story of violent work and violent love. (Reissue)
- THE TALL CAPTAINS by Bart Spicer. Historical Novel. This magnificent big novel about a young Scotsman who journeys to French Canada to fight beside General Montcalm is a "find" for lovers of fine historical novels.  $50\phi$
- A1919 THE RED KNIGHT OF GERMANY: The Story of Baron Von Richthofen by Floyd Gibbons. Non-Fiction. The true story of the World War I German Air Ace. Twelve pages of illustrations add to the sales appeal of this title. Abridged.
- A1908 THE PRICE OF COURAGE by Curt Anders. Novel. Here's a close, hard, painful look at ground combat in the Korean War from the viewpoint of a platoon commander.
- THE GELIGNITE GANG by John Creasey. Mystery. The second superb Inspector West Mystery on Bantam's list. This is about a series of jewel robberies -- all with the same "M.O." (Method of Operation) -- the safes are all blown open with explosive gelignite.  $25\phi$  (35¢ in Canada)

Dr. Milton Crane, distinguished scholar, critic, and author, of Washington, D.C., has been appointed by Bantam Books as special editorial consultant for the Bantam Classics, the new addition to the Bantam line. He will work closely with the editorial staff in evaluating titles for his new series, which will be chosen from the whole range of living literature -- novels, plays, stories, biographies, scientific accounts, travel.

Dr. Crane is the author of SHAKESPEARE'S PROSE, and editor of THE ROOSEVELT ERA, FIFTY GREAT SHORT STORIES and the forthcoming FIFTY GREAT POETS. is a reviewer for "The Saturday Review," "The New York Times Book Review" and "The Chicago Tribune Magazine of Books." His scholarly articles have been published in such magazines as "Publication of the Modern Language Association of America," "Shakespeare Quarterly," and the "Revue de Litterature Comparee."

After receiving his A.B. and A.M. from Columbia University, Dr. Crane began his academic career as a Teaching Fellow at Harvard College while completing his Ph.D. at Harvard University. He served with the Office of Strategic Services, 1943-1945, was Associate Editor at Bantam Books, 1945-1946, and was a member of the English Department at the College of William and Mary, Hunter College, and the University of Chicago.
