The Society of Montana Pioneers was formed September 18, 1884. Originally, only those who had come to the Territory prior to September 10, 1864 were eligible. Soon however, it was realized that many who had added to the Territory's growth had arrived a few years later. The admission date was changed to December 31, 1868. On August 18, 1892, the Sons and Daughters were organized. To be eligible for membership, descent from a Montanan who had arrived prior to the end of 1868 had to be proved. The organizations were created to supplement the work of the Historical Society of Montana by gathering information from all pioneers so future generations would know of their part in the development of the State.

It has been said, only the strong and the good survived. The weak never arrived . . . the wicked were banished or eliminated. The pioneers established law and order where there was no law. They founded the first settlements and protected them against hostile forces. They developed the mines and opened vast natural resources. They were the first tillers of the soil . . . the merchants . . . transportation agents . . . the engineers who constructed mills and water-plants. They were the builders who, using materials at hand, constructed comfortable homes in a wilderness country from native stone, lumber, brick. No task was too great to daunt them. To their new homes, they transplanted their culture. They established churches, schools, libraries. They encouraged an independent free press. They chose the ablest and wisest men to public office. And, most important, they had Faith. This Faith, coupled with integrity, courage, self-reliance and industry, carved Montana from a wilderness. These pioneers were our ancestors. Each of these meetings give us an opportunity to rededicate ourselves to the task so ably begun . . . to accept the challenge and carry on, as best we are able, the honorable development of Montana.

The Kessler Brewing Company, owned and operated by the descendants of Nickolas Kessler who founded the establishment in 1865, considers it a privilege to dedicate this program to All Montana Pioneers. Because of their enterprise, their courage, Montana is the Treasure State.
