The Book of Genesis.

Key verse 1:1: "In the beginning God created the heaven and the

earth." The Book of Origin.

The first two verses suggest the contents of the whole book: (I) Construction, "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth;" (2) Destruction, "The earth was (became) without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep." Doubtless a great cataclysm during the time between these verses. Isaiah 45:18 shows that original creation was perfect: "He created it not in vain." "In vain" here is the same Hebrew word as "without form," teaching that God did not create all things without form; (3) Reconstruction, "The Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

Under these three headings everything in Genesis may be classed:
