Hoping to hear from you soon, I am





Dear Mr. Relander:

It was good of you to send us a copy of your book "Strangers On the Land" for the District's Library. This is being properly recorded and identified and to be made available on a loan basis to the two hundred fifty employees of the District.

You mentioned in your letter to Mrs. Marcu Maddux that you hope, (and you certainly have every reason to) your extensive library will find a suitable repository for the benefit of future generations. May I suggest that you consider the Washington State University Library, Pullman. The two Universitys have a working agreement that materials East of the Cascades should go to Washington State (Pullman), and materials west of the Cascades should go to Washington University (Seattle), with the understanding materials accumulated at either institution are loanable to the other upon request.

If this suggestion does not presently appeal to you the Chelan County Public Utility District could, if withheld harmless, provide locked fire-proof, air conditioned storage in the Rocky Reach Project pending your decision whether said materials should ultimately go to one institution or the other. We grant of course, the more desirable location would be in either of the other locations where your materials could be properly cataloged by competent manuscript librarians.

May I repeat Mrs. Maddux' invitation to visit Rocky Reach when convenient to you. We are sure you will be pleasantly surprised.
