Roll call was answered by Editorials from current magazines which were very fine.

President Mrs Carlson told us she had attended the meeting of the Parent Teachers Movement and asked them to become an Auxiliary to Camp Club but they objected very strenuously.

There being no further business it was moved and seconded to adjourn and meet April 25th as April 11th our next meeting day falls on Arbor Day. every one was asked to plant a tree.
