Dear Mr. Todd:

Under separate cover I am sending, for your own possible personal collection, a copy of the Yakima Treaty Centennial.

This is unique inasmuch as it is the first time the Yakima Tribe has ever authorized such a publication, paid for by the tribe and printed because of the Treaty Centennial. I was asked to edit it, which I did gratis (in fact turned sections on the history of the Treaty and most of the Reservation history.

Caxton hasn't sent out circulars on Drummers and Dreamers of Priest Rapids, yet, but they should be here any day. Upon arrival, I will send you a specimen to determine your wants as to a personal imprint, for circularization. I'm heading for California in about two weeks and will thereafter be out of circulation for a couple of weeks.

Hope you like the Centennial item. I'm not overly proud of it since it was written, edited etc. to get to the printers in about 12 days, but I think it will stand up. I mention that because of course it isn't even a weak comparison with Drummers and Dreamers if I do a good job on printing, and I feel confident they will.
