Dear Sir:-

In accordance with your letter of yesterday I will see Mr Noble and have another blueprint map made of ~~the~~ ^{the} Platanum country and will hand it to Engr Jacobs.

Mr Noble has not lost the map tracing but seems to have lost the original of the sheet of data compiled regarding ditches, their history, ownership, when first constructed, when enlarged, capacity, acreage irrigated by each, ~~ditch~~, acreage under each ditch non-irrigated, alkali lands, etc, all made up in tabulated form on a sheet from which he intended to make prints. The sheet I think was about 24 or 28 inches long by about 18 or 20 inches wide and contained a lot of data. He has all the notes and can make another but it will require the repetition of a lot of work; this, if he has it to do, I should think should be without extra charge, or any additional charge. It seems he had made no prints from it yet.

I got Mr Lindsley and Noble together in Noble's office but Lindsley was not posted as to just what Atty Horry wants and Noble has written the latter asking for all the data he wants, suggesting a number of points concerning which he is in doubt. The proposed use of the data this time being for ~~the~~ use wherein the Gov't will be plaintiff instead of where it was ^(over)

information, I have seen a copy of Noble's letter to Avery
and it is to the point,
