## Miss Trimble Tells Of Plans for Work

A list of approximately 2500 children's books is now being compiled by Miss Carol Trimble, who actively assumed her new position as county librarian on Monday. Miss Trimble is working at the city library this week while renovations are going forward at the new county library building, 116 East A street.

### Choices Listed

New books on science, nature stories and animal tales are to be included in the list of selections scheduled for the children's department, as well as the story-books for leisure time reading which all children love, Miss Trimble says.

In speaking of the county library plans she remarked, "Naturally, I'm talking about the ultimate thing and not about what will take place right now or this year!" Up to this time applications for county book service have been received from Union Gap and Terrace Heights. Miss Trimble is

looking forward to the time when book service will be extended to every corner of the county, with the branch stations rotating books to give full coverage to all sections each year.

### Future Planned

Remote sections with small demand will be served during the war period through the mails, with a bookmobile anticipated for the service when it is possible to obtain a vehicle.

With twelve years of library experience behind her, Miss Trimble is enthusiastic in her anticipation of the development of this new phase of library work. After service in Toppenish as librarian at the junior-senior high school, Miss Trimble worked for a time with the library facilities at the army air base at Walla Walla before taking her post as librarian at Yakima Senior High school last year.
