A LITTLE HISTORY

. . . of Washington State

Washington was admitted to the Union November 11, 1889, as the forty-second state. It had been a territory since 1853—before that it was a part of the Orc-

gon territory.

What is now the State of Washington was first discovered by the Spaniards Heceta and Quadra in 1775 in their search for the Northwest Passage. Soon British Seamen were exploring Washington waters and by 1792 Capt. George Vancouver had explored Puget Sound and had given permanent names to most of the landmarks. Overland explorations began with the Lewis and Clark expedition which arrived at the mouth of the Columbia River in 1805.

British and American fur traders contended for control of the area for the next 40 years, but it remained for the land-hungry American settlers to claim the area

for the United States.

The State's leading industries are lumbering, fishing, mining and farming. Western Washington, particularly the Puget Sound area, is also important for ship building and repairing, and airplane manufacturing.

The population of Washington State is 2,528,200. Spokane is the second largest city in the state, with a population of 178,000. Seattle, the largest city, has

548,000 people.
