Sir,

I have the honor to state that I left the Saw mill yesterday and returned to my home.

When I left the Agency time I saw you and spoke to you about some labor I done and was not paid for, especially back to the 8th day of Aug when you suspended me, and dated me back to the last day of July, when you had ought to give me notice on the first day of Aug.⁹³ I felt that if I was treated like a dog by a new man who is sent here to help the poor Indians to the way of Civilization. But as far as Government is concern who is willing to do whatever is right through its faithful Agents. I have no hope that I should enter into the Government Service again as Sawyer under your Charge But I hope that a good Competent ^{man} be selected for this duty. As Mr. Clark told me the day I saw you that the Labor I done should cover the price of the Store he issued me, of which I agreed to.

Also that he should put me on a roll as an Employee from to-day.

I will state that the Store I got I think do

Not exceed \$800. I worked 2 day with team and mow
outside of the above referred to, and claim \$450 per day. \$900

Helping Nelson hauling hay @ \$200 per day

$\frac{400}{\text{Total } 1300}$

This months work I will not claim. I eat 7 meals while at
the mill Adams told me that he will report the same to you,
and whatever my Board Bill amounts Notify me and I will
remit the same by mail.

I have two white men Employed and the People think here
that I am renting my place to them, and perhaps some
one will put this into your mind.

But this is not the Case I am keeping
them in my place to Plow and Break up over 100 acres
of land if I can.

I herewith attach an estimate for some article which
is mud at the mill. Andree know the mill was too small
And ought to be Built 24 ft x 80 ft. If Cut-off
Saw attached. This Saw is at the mill and only need
Hanger.

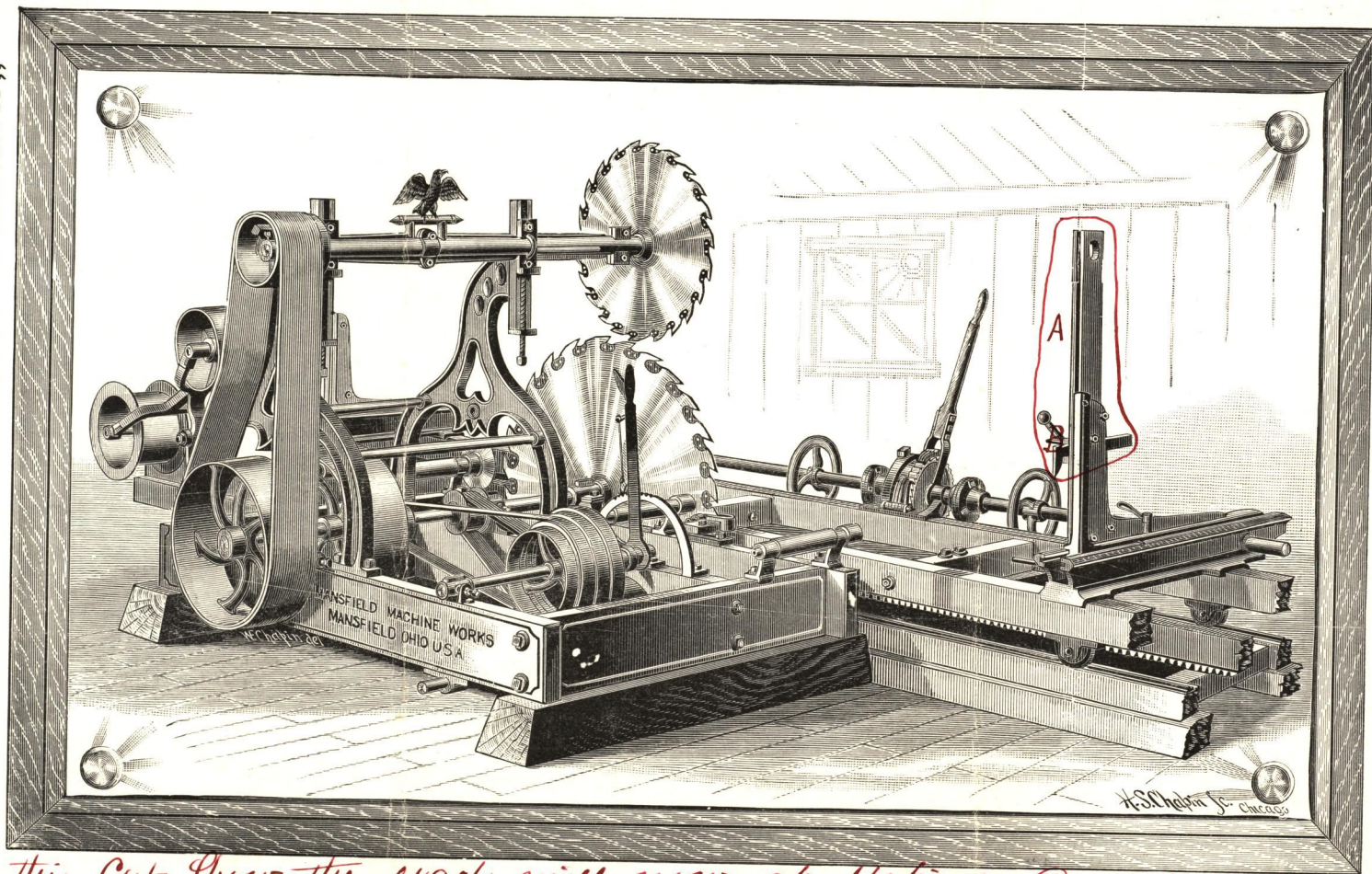
