SPECIAL EVENTS

FRIDAY EVENING — JUNE 25TH

Each Area Council, which is a component part of the Washington Square and Folk Dance Federation will serve as individual hosts at separate dances in and around the Festival City of Yakima on this night.

In this way the dancers will meet their friends from all over the State. Dancers should plan to spend a little time at each of these dances. In this way they can enjoy the wonderful Callers from each Area. It is unfortunate that every caller in the State won't be able to participate in the big "FESTIVAL" dance on Saturday night, but time simply doesn't permit. Plan to visit each and every dance on Friday night.

Locations of these individual dances and the Host councils may be located in the legend "DANCING AROUND" at the bottom of your Festival Map.

SATURDAY MORNING — JUNE 26TH

Starting at 11:00 A.M. and running through 2:00 P.M., will be the dancing clinics. These clinics will consist both of panel discussions and actual presentations of the dance.

Approximately one-half of this three hour period of time will be devoted to square dancing, and one-half to round dancing.

The panel discussions will give each dancer and instructor an opportunity to listen to or participate in the pros and cons of the different phases of dancing.

The square dance clinic will be presented by such well known individuals as Ted Powell of Yakima, Dr. Wm. (Bill) Price of Seattle, Heber Shoemaker of Seattle, and Roy Miller of Bellingham. A highlight of this clinic will be an address by "Chuck Jones" of Hollywood, Calif. "Chuck" has been on the staff of Sets in Order Asilomar teachers institute for several years.

The round dance clinic will be presented by Jim and Ginny Brooks of Alderwood Manor, Gay and Dottie Wright of Auburn, and Charley and Charlotte Cook of Yakima. Plus an added attraction — Chuck Jones and his "Taw" Dottie. An important objective of this clinic will be to try to obtain a workable and satisfactory method of establishing a "dance of the month" for the State of Washington.

NOTE: Location of the Clinics will be at LOCATION NO. 2 on your Festival Map. (Washington Jr. High School).

SATURDAY AFTERNOON — JUNE 26TH

A Rodeo will be going on at the same time — No extra charge.



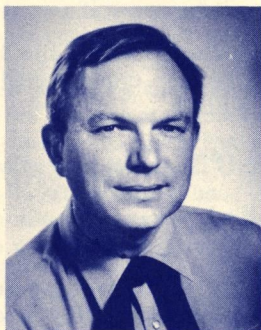
