A committee to select artists for the Second Governor's Invitational Art Show to be held at the State Capitol Museum in Olympia January 9 through February 13 was named this week by Governor Daniel J. Evans.

The exhibit will feature the work of forty-two of the state's top painters and sculptors. One artist will be chosen by the committee for a special commendation award from the Governor.

The Second Governor's Invitational Art Show will be the first art event in a six-month series of cultural affairs planned for the capital city in the Governor's Festival of Arts.

The selections committee will include: Mrs. Ebba Rapp McLauchlan and James W. Washington, Jr., both of Seattle and representing the Washington State Arts Commission; Gervais Reed, Associate Director, Henry Gallery, Seattle; Edward Thomas, Associate Director, Seattle Art Museum, Seattle; William Colby, Associate Professor of Art, University of Puget Sound, Tacoma; Keith Monaghan, Chairman of the Department of Fine Arts, Washington State University, Pullman; Dr. Steven Bayless, Department of Art, Central Washington State College, Ellensburg; and Fred Goldberg, vice-president, State Capitol Museum, Olympia.

Kenneth R. Hopkins, director of the State Capitol Museum, will coordinate plans for the invitational show.

Plans are in the making, Hopkins said, for the exhibit to travel approximately a year following its showing in Olympia.
