Dear Miss Boury:

Thank you for your inquiry concerning "Strangers on the Land," and the same to Mrs. Mills.

This is a tribal publication and the price is \$2.25, postage paid. I am assisting the tribe getting it off the ground, withdraw so many books and turn in so much in checks or the order may be sent direct to the tribe,

It is not hard cover, hence the price. But it contains 63,000 words, which as you know is the amount in a standard size volume.

The "going-out-of-print," The Yakimas, 1855-1955, published in 1955 at the time of the Treaty Centennial contains about 25,000 words, was published at \$1 but because there are only an armful of copies left this price was raised to \$2. I do not think there will be any copies of "Strangers" left in a month or so, not even that time if it were known about extensively here. It was published at 2,000 copies. There were 7,500 of the Treaty booklets published and they are nearly gone and no effort was made to dispose of them.

Unless you have an exceptional interest in Yakima material, I do not think you would want the Treaty book. But "Strangers" has more Yakima material than I now exists elsewhere.
