Mickey Wittner, Wapato Librarian, reports on the library's parade entry on Sept. 5th:

"The walking puppet theatre was a big attraction in the Wapato Harvest Festival Parade. We had a very authentic "Amelia Bedelia" and "Curious George and the man in the yellow hat," plus three sandwich sign boards promoting the library. We weren't able to pass out all the stickers Karen Spence sent down because two of our volunteer juniors got cold feet at the last minute and one got sick. Those in costume and signboards were limited in how many stickers they could pass out and still keep up with the parade. All the participants had a great time and decided they would like to do it again next year."

CCS Overdues

Overdues for books checked out on the CCS went out recently, so you should be seeing a larger number of returns coming through your libraries. This run produced about 8,000 overdues system-wide. Given the cost for the large number of notices that have to be mailed, we are scheduled to send overdues on a quarterly basis.

TRACERS: When a patron claims they have returned an item they got an overdue for, or that they never checked an item out, they should call the overdue number, 453-1720. If they can't (or won't) call Yakima, fill out a tracer card for them and send it in. Tell them that they don't need to worry unless they get

another notice in several months, when we do the next overdue run. Explain that in the meantime we will check all 21 libraries for that book, and suggest that they also check again at home, in the car, etc.

You will not get tracer cards back for items charged on the CCS. When a tracer item is found, it is cleared off the patron record, stopping the process. If it is not found, it will appear again on their next overdue notice.

Information Specialist David Little is working with me to improve our response to tracers in the non-CCS libraries, and to shorten the tracer list you receive. Call me (Amy) with your comments or suggestions.
