

Your letter of April eighth to the President has been received and you may be assured that he appreciates your courtesy in writing on behalf of Mr. Puck Hyah Toot.

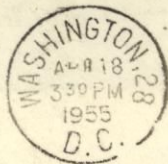


