Dear Mr. Todd:

Thank you for your letter of June 3 regarding the  
Treaty Centennial Booklet and Drummers and Dreamers circular.

I'll be heading California-ward in a couple of days now.

I sent out another letter in this morning's mail, which you can  
disregard, excepting for perhaps sending in an exact wording for  
the way you want your name on the circulars.

I don't think Caxtons will be getting into these now quite so soon,  
and I am submitting a couple of changes in the circular, minor but  
important. (In letter today I enclosed you a couple of samples)

Just drop one back with a specimen of how you handle your name,  
address etc. and when I get back, get things under control it will  
come through in due time with their schedule.

I've got quite a bit more ground work now before uncorking, such  
as arranging with my writing friends for a barrage of stories on  
the "anapums, the upcoming book etc. and I want to get the timing  
right.

I'll see the Yakimas get your treaty booklets into the mail. They're  
returnable remember. In fact I'll have them packaged at the office  
and mail them out direct to you tomorrow. They are coming off the  
press them. The Yakimas will bill you from the agency, 40 per cent  
on an item to sell for \$1, and in case they move you can reorder direct  
through the Yakima agency at Toppenish.

I know one enrolled Yakima in Seattle and she must know lots more.  
I think she and the girl she ~~works~~ lives with, works, but if you have  
someone call Maxine Robbins (Robbins) see in your phone directory  
and tell her what you have in, she'll pass the word around. She might  
be coming over to the Treaty Celebration and pick one up here.

Thanks again for your cooperation. I think something very good will  
come from it. I realize there's not much in it for the writer in books  
like this (The main one by Caxton) but I intend to do a thorough job  
because of the work put in on it.
