**NEW ADDITION** to the Sunnyside Public Library are two new paper-back book racks furnished by the Yakima Valley Regional Library Board, according to Debbie Stilson, librarian. The racks give easy access to books, are mobile and in the four sections.

Debbie Stilson came to Sunnyside in September. She received a bachelor of arts degree from Cal State University and a master of library science degree from the University of British Columbia, Canada. She formerly was high school librarian at Prince George College High School.

Other items available on loan are records, cassettes, and pictures and paintings for interior decorating.

"We have the largest reference book selection in the Valley next to the Regional Library in Yakima," said the new librarian who looks forward to meeting patrons and community members.

The library can obtain books which are not available here through the Yakima Regional Library and the State Library for patrons.

"Lots of good movies are available in the library for the month of January including "Santa Fe Trail", starring Errol Flynn, Olivia De Havilland, and Ronald Reagan and "The Nutcracker", starring the N.Y. City Ballet Company. If you have a current library card, you may check out up to 3 films per visit. The library also rents out a 16 mm movie projector at the cost of \$2.50 per day," she added.
