Office Nez Perces Indian Agency, Lapwai, July 20, 1866

...in the towns, Lewiston, Oro Fino and Pearce City, the inhabitants are becoming alarmed and public meetings have been held. By request of the citizens I attended one of their meetings in Lewiston last week and told them that if they would try and stop selling whiskey to the suspicious whites and take care of them, I would try and look out for the Indians.

Oro Fino is on the reservation about ninety miles from the agency.

"With the three or four thousand whites and Chinamen mining within the bounds of the reservation and the same number of Indians who consider these miners as interlopers who are taking their farms and gold from them, unless we have soldiers there is bound to be collision between them.

...One log and one frame house have been erected for the Indian chiefs, We-as-cus and Sim-sle-poo, opposite Lewiston.
