There were 238 places incorporated in Washington in 1950 with a total of 1,422,983 inhabitants. Since April, 1950 there has been 3 new incorporated places these being - Electric City, Grant County with a population of 1,317 which was incorporated on Aug. 4, 1950; Du Pont, Pierce County with a population of 353 which was incorporated on May 11, 1951 and Battle Ground, Clark County with a population of 742 which was incorporated on June 18, 1951.

The total 1940 urban population was 1,059,018.

State Total 1950 - 2,378,963 . During the previous 10 years, the population of the State increased by 642,772, or 37.0 percent, over the 1,736,191 population figure for 1940.
