TONIGHT'S STARS

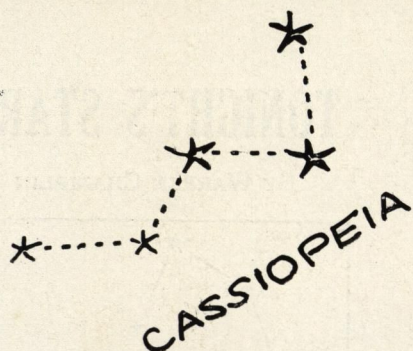

The Arabic name for Eta Ophiuchi (Eta of Ophiuchus) is Sabik, which means "the driver." This second magnitude, yellow-white star is in the left knee of Ophiuchus, the Serpent Bearer. The feet of this giant constellation rest on Scorpius (low in the southwest) just above bright Antares, the first magnitude, red star that is the heart of the constellation Scorpius. Another of our zodiacal constellations, Libra (the Scales), low in the west, is slipping away from us now, as is brilliant Arcturus (of Bootes), but returning to our early evening June skies.

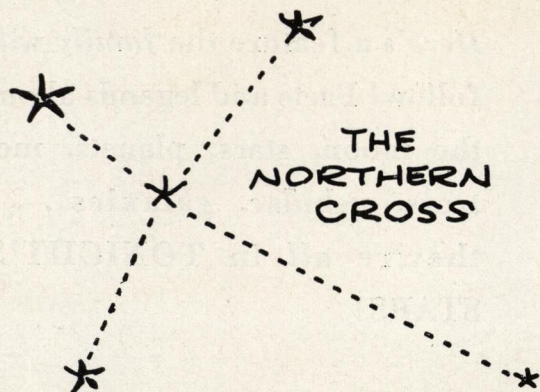
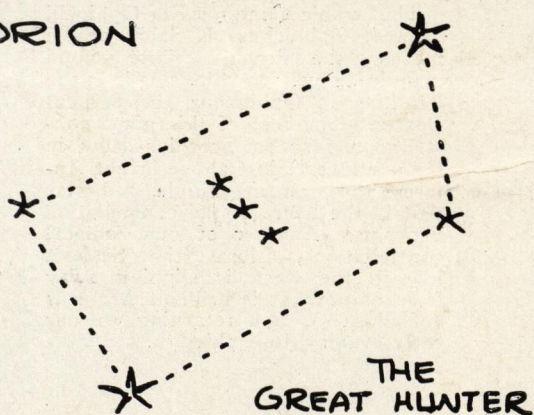
