Sir:

Referring to previous correspondence relative to the transfer of the property now at Malheur Agency to Yakama, and to telegram of the 14th. instant, I have to direct that you take all the movable property, if possible including the flour. It is not thought to be advisable to sell anything

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at Malheur except the buildings, which are to be sold, if the reservation be disposed of in that way, at the same time. Special Agent A. R. Smith has been ordered to this city, ^{and} you will complete the removal of the property with the assistance of Farmer-in-Charge Rinehart who has this day been directed to act in concert with you. You will pass invoices ^{and} receipts with him, ^{and} move as rapidly as possible. The abandonment of Malheur

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must be fully completed on
or before the commencement
of the next fiscal year
