Euclid, a school and settlement of fruit growers in the southeastern part of Yakima county. There is no town as indicated on some maps. (Postmaster of Grandview in Names MSS Letter 498.)

Eureka, a town in the west central part of Walla Walla county.

It was platted on June 6, 1904 by Mrs. A.B. Blanchard on what was known as Eureka Flat. (Illustrated History of Southeastern Washington, Page 167)

Evans, a town in the northwestern part of Stevens County.

The name was given in 1901 in honor of J.H. Evans, president of the Idaho Lime Company, which had established lime works there.
