Joe Garry was certainly correct in his remarks, but within the past three years, due to pressure groups wishing to come into Indian land and timber holdings, the "public image" has been quite distorted. I am glad that Rowland has not been so "influenced."

Because of your proximity to Tacoma I know you are acquainted with the Lewis and Clark material there. They have some fine items, not to speak of the material in the library. And I agree with you that keeping a relic such as the "Targe copper hand made" kettle from the old Hudson Bay Post" has satisfaction and enjoyment for one so appreciative of histery. Might I however implant the idea that it would be well to "document" the history of this item, and the other items mentioned, and remember that at some future time these things could prove of interest to the many, young and old, who frequent the Washington State Historical Society Museum. It would not be amiss, on some visit to the museum, to take a couple of the items with you, and let Bruce LeRoy, the director, look them over and then you can take them "home to be enjoyed." He could perhaps tell you how at some time in future years they might fig into a collection of special items.

I wish to thank you for your letter, noting especially that many people might think of writing, but few show the energy and have the spirit of history deep enough to sit down and actually write.
