Dear Sir:

I am sending you under separate cover a copy of this morning's Yakima Herald and no doubt you will be interested in knowing what the State District Engineer proposes to offer in the way of road improvement in the Yakima valley with particular reference to the Toppenish-Goldendale road now known as State Highway No. 8.

I thought of writing you a few days ago regarding a meeting which is called for in Wenatchee on the 11th and 12th of December. This meeting has been called by a gentleman from Thurston County I believe, whom you know is chairman of the state road program. Possibly you are well aware of the program that will come at Wenatchee. We have no information here except from the press and we understand that Lieutenant Governor Johnson disapproves of this meeting so it may not be of any material value.

I know that you will appreciate that our road between our two cities will have consideration and no doubt a word timely spoken to your legislators might be of great help when the matter is presented to the legislature.
