However I will have to admit we are very happy to have the information and I just know Mrs. Gossett will be too. It was so very kind of you to do this for us, and thank you a thousand times for your effort. We hope we can help you out some time. You went to the bottom of this situation and your records are undisputable and that settles the question for us.

As long as there is no proof of the fort's existence here at Naches there would be no reason for me to continue making the painting for I would have no central point of interest to work from. So I have given up the idea.

Mrs. Gossett is to be here Saturday evening for my husband to discuss the Satus country with her. My husband is a native citizen here as his grandfather helped grub sagebrush off the land where Yakima now stands. He <sup>(The grandfather)</sup> was a homesteader here and lived thru the Indian days. He can tell much about Yakima Valley history.
