Suptoy. of Indian Affairs Letters from agts. M employees of Suptoy. Yakima Agency, Jan. 4, 1369-July 21, 1874.

As in past instances, I have scanned them, attaching slips to facilitate the work of attorneys and others interested.

At this stage I confess I do not know whether these should become Addendum to Yakima MS-I, Palouse MS-I etc. or whether they should accumulate in chronological order, becoming an extensive picture of the transcripts of the Microcopy series. They represent all microfilm included on the rolls excepting obvious valueless material.

To expedite arranging or distributing them for your best purpose, I am not specifying how they should be accumulated. I am sending in separate lots, with separate covers, however, the various rolls (each individually)

May I at this time request if I am expected to file a nominal time report for gathering, scenning etc. I assure you it would be nominal to the extreme in view of time required to transcribe, etc. ut your ethnologists, atterneys etc. who have viewed microfilm, know what a slow process this is.

May I note too that my supply of franked envelopes for mailing this type of material is now down to seven (seven) envelopes the size sent herewith.
