

# 1. YE OLDE CURIOSITY SHOP

World famous Seattle Waterfront attraction featured in several national magazines; since 1899. Curios, imports, totem poles and art objects. 601 Alaskan Way, Pier 51. Open 7 days.

### 2. THE POLYNESIA

One of the world's most beautiful restaurants. Superb steaks, seafood and Polynesian cuisine served in authentic South Seas atmosphere. Pier 51. Reservations, phone MA 4-6995.

### 3. SURFSIDE FISH & CHIPS

Pier 51 next to Ye Olde Curiosity Shop. Enjoy fine food on comfortable outdoor seating and enjoy the view of Puget Sound.

# 5. CLARK'S CABIN 52

Seattle's newest waterfront restaurant. Carefree shipboard atmosphere. Come aboard for lunch, dinner, cocktails. Open 7 days a week. Ferry Terminal, Pier 52, foot of Marion Street.

## 6. IVAR'S ACRES OF CLAMS & FISH BAR

Pier 54. Foot of Madison Street. Outdoor eating overlooking the fireboats and indoor dining of delicious seafoods from Puget Sound and the Pacific Ocean.

Pier 56, next to Trident Imports.

Pier 56, foot of Seneca Street. Open 7 days a week, 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Thousands of unusual and exciting items from the markets of the world, at direct import prices.

The waters of Puget Sound and the bustle of a busy waterfront surround the restful, luxurious rooms of the world's only hotel built entirely over water, on Pier 67.

# PROWLING SEATTLE'S WATERFRONT

There is always something fascinating about prowling the waterfront of a port city. Seattle, gateway to Alaska and the Orient, is no exception.

Along pier-studded Elliot Bay, just a few steps from the downtown business district, you can spend hours or days watching ships loading or unloading cargo, visiting many interesting spots, or just absorbing the colorful atmosphere that is a part of waterfront activities.

In the space of just a few blocks you can dine at colorful waterfront restaurants specializing in seafoods, steaks or fine Polynesian foods, shop for unique Indian art and souvenirs in a world famous curiosity shop or a large import store featuring gifts from the Far East and around the world, watch sleek ferries plying Puget Sound from a new terminal, or view fireboats moored in readiness in a central area of the waterfront.

In the midst of this busy waterfront you will want to see the ocean's inhabitants alive; at the home of the world renowned killer whales where you'll see them in action along with seals, dolphins and other denizens of the sea.

To make your visit to Seattle's waterfront truly complete, be sure to take a tour of the harbor by boat. Excursions are a daily feature during the summer months and encompass not only a waterfront cruise, but a trip to Tillicum Village on Blake Island.

Riding a ferry boat is a must for most visitors to Washington. You can park your car at a waterfront parking lot and board a ferry for such points as Vashon Island, Bremerton or Winslow and spend the better part of a day cruising upon the blue waters of Puget Sound.

If you wish to stay on Downtown's waterfront a luxurious hotel built entirely over the water will be a most pleasant experience.

You can capture the romance of the sea in a tour of Seattle's waterfront and do it all within walking distance from your hotel room or the downtown business district.
