BRIGADIER GENERAL STEVE A. CHAPPUIS

Steve A. Chappuis was born in Rayne, Louisiana, December 28, 1913. He graduated from Louisiana State University in June 1936. In July 1936 he entered on active duty under the Thomason Act Program, being assigned to the 23d Infantry at Fort Sam Houston, Texas as a Second Lieutenant, United States Army Reserve. He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant of Infantry in Regular Army on 3 July 1937. In March 1939 he was transferred to Schofield Barracks, Hawaii for duty with the 27th Infantry, Hawaiian Division.

He returned to the United States in March 1941 for assignment with the 368th Infantry at Fort Huachuca, Arizona. Having been selected for parachute training he was transferred to Fort Benning, Georgia in August, 1941, where he was successively assigned to the Parachute School, the 502d Parachute Infantry Battalion, and the Infantry School to attend the Battalion Commander's Course. Upon the expansion of the 502d P.I. Battalion into the 502d Parachute Infantry Regiment early in 1942, he served first as regimental S3 and later on 1 July 1942 as Commanding Officer of the 2d Battalion. He moved with his unit to Fort Bragg, North Carolina, in August 1942, when the regiment was assigned to the newly organized 101st Airborne Division. The division was transferred to the ETO in September, 1943.

Lieutenant Colonel Chappuis participated in the airborne invasions of Normandy in June 1944 and Holland in September 1944 as Commanding Officer of the 2d Battalion, 502d. For these operations he was awarded the Silver Star, Franch Croix de Guerre and Military Willems Order (Netherlands.) He assumed command of the 502d Parachute Regiment on 22 September 1944 during the Holland operation and continued in this assignment until deactivation of this unit and its parent division in December 1945. He was promoted to Colonel in February 1945. Colonel Chappuis was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for participation in the defense of Bastogne during the Battle of the Bulge in December - January 1944-1945.

Following World War II Colonel Chappuis served with AGF, Department of Army General Staff, Department Defense Staff and attended the Canadian Army College and the Army War College. Following assignments to SHAPE with duty station in the Hague, Netherlands and Headquarters Allied Forces Southern Europe, Naples, he served as Deputy Chief of Staff, Operations for the 18th Airborne Corps, Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He returned to the United States from Korea in April 1962 after serving as Deputy Chief of Staff, 1st Corps Group for sixteen months.

He was assigned as Deputy Commander, 4th Infantry Division Brigade in May 1962. In September 1972, Colonel Chappuis was promoted to Brigadier General and was assigned as Assistant Division Commander, 4th Infantry Division, Fort Lewis, Washington.
