

About Grant County Airport

History:

Activated in November 1942 as Moses Lake Army Air Base for the training of fighter pilots and bomber crews. In 1945 the Base was placed on "standby" military status. It was used during the following three years as a testing site for Boeing B-47's and B-50's. Resumed military operation in November 1948; in 1950 the Base was renamed Larson Air Force Base, honoring Major Donald A. Larson of Yakima, who was killed in action over Germany in 1944. From 1948 to 1965, missions included fighters, transports, bombers, aerial refueling and intercontinental ballistic missiles. Boeing B-52's and KC-135's were flight tested and modified at the Flite Test Genter from 1955 through 1962. Deactivated and declared surplus as of June 25, 1966.

Present & Future:

Presently operating at the Grant County Airport are the Boeing Flight Training program (on an agreement extending through 1980), FAA (control tower), Army mapping service, Job Corps Training Center for 200, Big Bend Community College North Campus (vocational-technical program, including commercial pilot training), Moses Lake Sheet Metal and John Henry Metal Fabricator, American Potato Company, Greeneair (flying school) and Jim Abram's Jet-Air (fuel service).

Potential future uses include expanded flight training programs, flight testing and modification at the excellent Flite Test Center, industrial manufacturing, fabrication, assembly, food processing, air freight and warehousing and many others.

About the Moses Lake Port District

Authorized by the voters in 1965, the formation of the Port District was given impetus by the closing of Larson Air Force Base. The Port was visualized by the cummunity as the most logical means of assisting in the transition of the Base to a civilian economy. While its initial activity is directed at the utilization of facilities at Grant County Airport, the Port is in a logical position to play a large part in the development of other potentials in the area, including farm-related industry and recreation.



The Grant County PUD is prepared to serve the electrical needs of future development on the Grant County Airport as it does in all of Grant County.
