The Yakimas have never before authorized a publication , but when the matter was discussed I told them I was confident it would pay for itself in the Yakima Valley among pioneer groups and those historically minded, thereby costing the tribe nothing.

I am sure that if you have use for another copy or so there will be a few surplus available and that Alex Saluskin, chairman of the Centennial Committee and secretary of the Yakima Tribal Council would be most happy to take care of your request.
