Sir:

Indian Nish-Ki-a-cut, of Your reservation, at present located at Nespilum, Cohille reserve, calls at the Agency to day and states that he has left Your reservation and intends to locate permanently among the Moses band of Columbia's at Nespilum and desires to have some of his relatives and friends at Yakama to come with him. He also states that Chief Mo-Ka-Ya-Chin, before he died, promised him that he could take his relatives with him to Nespilum, among them the chiefs son, Sho-wa-way, but says that You and the policemen of that reserve would not let them come. —

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There appears to be something about this case that Nish-Ki-a-cut is not willing to impart, but wishes me to assist him to get his followers moved.

I told him that I would write to you and ask if there was any objection on your part to let these Indians come here. - Not knowing anything about the case would be pleased to hear from you on this subject.
