The Recruit has recently discussed two alternatives in the Army's three-legged enlistment program - guaranteed assignment to technical schools, or guaranteed assignment to specific job areas. There remains to be explained the third alternative, guaranteed assignment to specific overseas areas. An example will best show what is meant by "travel in modern Army green".

For a limited time the Army is accepting enlistments for guaranteed assignment to the Fourth Infantry Regiment in Bamberg, Germany. CLOSING ENLISTMENT DATE FOR THIS ASSIGNMENT IS FEBRUARY 10, 1959. Men enlisted for this assignment will receive basic training in the United States prior to being sent, as part of a "GRYOSCOPE PACKET," to join the Regiment in Germany. There is no need to speak of the attractiveness of assignment to Germany. The high living standard, the cultural opportunities, and the natural beauty are common knowledge. The chance for a U.S. citizen to enjoy these advantages is one offered to very few.

The Fourth Infantry cleared the way for the settlement of Indiana in 1812; it served in the Seminole Wars, in the American Revolution, the Civil War, the Mexican War, and in both World Wars. In all, with its colors bearing streamers of forty-four major battles and campaigns, the Fourth Infantry is one of the most decorated of all Army fighting units. Today it stands proudly on guard with the NATO forces in Europe.
