WASHINGTON STATE FERRIES FILLERS:

Ten of the ferryboats now operating under the Washington State Ferry flag once traversed the waters of San Francisco Bay, before the Bay bridges were completed, in the 1930's.

With the addition of the M.V. HYAK and the near completion of the three other Superferries, the Washington State Ferry system comprises the largest ferry fleet in the world.

The Washington State Ferry, M.V. KALAKALA, recently sold at auction, made 35,601 round trips between Seattle-Bremerton from July 22, 1935 to August 8, 1952, and traveled 1,007,229.5 nautical miles.

The M.V. ELWHA will take just 25 minutes for the Seattle-Winslow crossing instead of the 35 minutes now needed.

The entire cost of the four superferries for the Washington State Ferries is \$24 million.

All Washington State Ferries are equipped with marine radiotelephones. All regularly scheduled Washington State Ferries are equipped with radar.
