While I do not represent the Yakimas in any way, I am sure that they would want you to have a copy of their Treaty Centennial Booklet which I edited and for which I wrote a couple of sections.

It was a rush job, and for that I am sorry, but there was little time to get it ready for the printers.

Your copy is being sent under separate cover. It's a 64 pp. illustrated item.

The Yakimas have never authorized a publication, but they felt that this is a "once in a hundred years" event and that the item would pay for itself here in the Yakima Valley, thereby costing the tribe nothing. I contributed my time, off hours, to it, as did all participants, and am helping to publicize it in the Valley so it will pay its own way.

I am sure that if you have use for another copy or so there will be a few surplus ones hanging around and that Alex Saluskin, chairman of the Centennial Committee and secretary of the Yakima Tribal Council would be most happy to take care of your request.
