Memo on style changes:

On front, use 8-col. Logo, with weather ears; hed over weather ears, one-line 14 pt., such as "Colder Yesterday" or "Heat Wave Due".

On front, no more 84 or 96 cap lines; top story under ~~XXXXXX~~ logo at least for now, usually with cut at left and two or more lines 72 or 60 clc flush left, not necessarily full lines.

No more one-line heds except over weather and, in makeup, if ~~R-4~~ R-4 must be cut to a one-liner with one graf in the form, that's ok. Only other exception, inside, one-line multiple column heds such as valley, and all these must use a kicker.

No more 24 pt heds over 2-cols., go to 30 or 36 point.

No more time fillers; no more 2-heds, even as folo on story--use R-4. or larger for folo.

"Eyed" in all forms is out, in headlines.

Use YESTERDAY, TODAY AND TOMORROW IN ALL LOCAL, and wherever possible with time available change to that style in wire.

In Valley, for top story use a 1-hed "By Staff Correspondent" or if that out of question, use "Special to The Republic" in dateline.

No heads over pictures, such as headline, then picture then story. In case of wraps (two or more columns) with art, always use art top ~~right~~ ^{right}, start story left and wrap under art.

CUTLINES - Continue same cutline type and style except don't use title in the cap words, start theme in cutlines such as "FIREMEN SHOOT WATER on burning warehouse, etc...." In 1-col. cutlines with story, use only name in BFC center, and if more identity needed, such as Lions President, use c and 1c second line center. ~~In 1-col. cutlines without story, use~~ In that, use body type, 8 pt. Unless other 1-col.s (that stand alone without story) are in combination with other cuts, use body type on 1-col. cutlines, with same cutline style, bfc first few words then just bf.

On all inside pages, use either a cut or black hed two col. or more in upper left where dummy allows it.

We'll use an index daily on front, which I'll prepare, showing fixtures, etc.
