INDIAN HORSE RACE was painted at Priest Rapids by E. B. Quigley.

He has gained prominence as a ranking painter of western scenes and makes sketching trips to the Indian country for atmosphere and authenticity. The Wanapum Indians described oldtime races for the painter who found the rock pile turning marker still along the river. The cleft in the mountains, through which the Columbia River flows, is Beverly Gap and just above that is the site of the proposed dam, named Wanapum by the project planners, the Grant County PUD of Ephrata in honor of the River People. The book, Drummers and Dreamers, is their story.
