The Legislature is a thing of the past and we are informed an appropriation of \$400,000 was made for the Satus road, which ought to help out considerable, if properly used.

In addition we are promised by the powers that be, in Olympia an additional \$100.000 from the Federal funds coming to this state.

We have had two men over there a few days to look after our interest and I think it helped out some.

I presume this work will be strung out over the next two years, but we should try and have as much done this year as possible and try to get the piezes improved connected up so the portion built can be used.

If we obtain a half million from both ffinds it ought to grade the road on up to the summit of the mountain a nd in the meantime this side can be smoothed up some for temporary use.

We hope you and your people will urge the department to do as much of the work as possible this year, for during the last two years they did not make use of the small fund left us.

We have had plenty of moisture here and the wheat has come through the winter in good shape.
