I have received your letter of the 2nd ultimo, containing a list of "squaw men" (six in number) resident on the Yakama Reserve, with the remarks pertinent to each case.

As was stated in Office letter to Special Agent Dickson, May 11, 1886, lawful marriage, and good behaviour must be conditions precedent to the husbands remaining on the reservation.

You will take measures to see that these conditions are complied with.
