here for stealing some horses. If for nothing
more, I presume Dick Harmon would hardly
dare to try to bring him along. Just now
I am having the North Boundary of the Reservation
surveyed, and want all my policemen to know exactly
where the line is, so cannot well spare them to go.
Perhaps one of your police men could come with
them to The Dalles, where one of mine could meet them
by that time. If this cannot conveniently be done
I will send a policeman as soon as I can spare
