Enclosed herewith is the current issue in our series of annual reports on municipal population entitled <u>Population Trends</u>, <u>Cities and Towns</u>, <u>State of Washington</u>: <u>1900 to 1967</u>.

You will observe that Chapter 1 includes a summary of population data, as well as a discussion of recent population changes, for the 267 incorporated cities and towns of the state of Washington, derived as of April 1, 1967.

Chapter 2 presents an analysis of the more significant long-time trends in population since 1900 for Washington's incorporated cities and towns.

This is the last report on <u>Population Trends of Cities and Towns</u> to be prepared under the auspices of the Washington State Census Board. The statutory functions and responsibilities of the Census Board were transferred, effective July 1, 1967, to the newly established Planning and Community Affairs Agency.
