
Enclosed herewith is the current issue in our series of annual reports on municipal population entitled Population Trends, Cities and Towns, State of Washington: 1900 to 1967.

The statutory functions and responsibilities of the Census Board were transferred, effective July 1, 1967, to the newly established Planning and Community Affairs Agency.
