# COPY OF WESTERN UNION TELEGRAM

NIGHT LETTER

Toppenish, Wash., June 19th. 1922

Washington, D.C.

have wired Commissioner Burke as follows:

- Senator Jones wires us, removal of Indian Agency temporarily deferred owing investigation conditions at Toppenish. Toppenish Commercial Club invites full and complete impartial investigation of all questions at issue or involved. We protest and deny highly colored published statements as credited to Indians but which have been inspired. Indians have been misinformed and misled as to the facts regarding conditions in Toppenish and alleged use of tribal funds in constructing building. Toppenish in good faith has fulfilled all requirements of your department for removal of the Agency. We have incorporated, have purchased site, raised necessary funds, let contract subject approval plans from your department. Our City Officials pledge themselves ready to cooperate ~~in every~~ with the government in every possible manner for the protection and betterment of the Indian and will act on any recommendation for improvement resulting from investigation. May we ask for early action.

Will appreciate your able assistance in securing prompt adjustment and keeping us posted as to developements.
