I don't know if you also have received a dribbling of library
orders in advance, but you should, or perhaps they will come along
later. I received numerous reports from libraries all over that they
are down on Caxtons "standing order" list.

If nothing else was gained by circularizing the libraries so
thoroughly, I am convinced they have been set up for the future as
over 75 of them deal with special Indian collections or are specific
Indian libraries.

Enclosed, too, are a few clippings to show that the Priest Rapids
Dam is working out on schedule as outlined to you in the past by my
deductions. You understand of course that the bond sales are for
only the initial construction. The power contract sales include
options for Wanapum Dam and the bond sale process will be repeated in
that case in a year and a half or two years, another \$166,000,000
worth.

Removal of the painted rocks from the Island, one of the
first things to be done late in July, together with construction of a
home for the Indians etc. and the actual construction itself will
set the book up good, and the orders should come dribbling in. The
full significance of this is just sinking into some of the dealers.
I have reached the point on my talking, book tour etc. now where I
have to ring off because I'm full up.
