Dear Librarian:

I am sending the enclosed circular in the belief you may be interested in a forthcoming book by an Indiana "native son." I know the Washington State Library has a special collection of Washington authors.

I was born at Danville or near there in 1908, and finished grammar school there. My early interest in Indian things was stimulated by arrowhead hunting on our old place, although Indiana does not enter into the book, (more so than it deals with the general Indian situation).

I am sending an extra circular in case you would favor me by forwarding it to the proper acquisition department in the state library.

In event any order is placed, the library will receive the usual library discount. No payment need be made in advance and the order should be sent to me so I can forward it to the publisher. The book will be issued in the spring and advance orders of this kind help determine the number to be published. Necessarily a book of this type will be of short publication.

My own library contains many works of Indiana authors and not a small amount of source material on Indiana history although nothing I am sorry to say that can be properly classified as "rare."
