The names I mentioned, Sol Sweet, Visalia and Miss Annie Mitchell, Visalia (just Visalia would reach them, they are well known there) would be best bet on photos, plus Joe Doctor at Exeter, Calif. He is well known there. He worked for W.S. Clawson, who published the Exeter Sun and W.S. (Watt) Clawson was quite familiar with the Mineral King country. I suspect he might be dead.
