work to be done to get the printing done, envelopes of the invitations I am sending out addressed, and other details to attend to, including preparation of a variety of talks to fit various areas, I would appreciate a confirmation at this time that you desire me on such and such a date and at such and such hours.

Additionally, the ground breaking ceremonies of Priest Rapids am will be held about mid-eptember and since I and the Indians have been invited to participate, that will require more time so I must get these others matters attended to now.

The PUD, which is building the Priest Rapids Project and which has named one of the dams, Wanapum after my small group of Indians, flew out some top executives to confer with us last aturday and when these things materialize, together with other things, the Indians will be much in the news in connection with this project. And as you know, Portland eneral lectric contracted for 13.9 per cent of the power from Priest apids, as did the Patific Power and Light Co. McMinville, Milton-Freewater, cities in Orggon contracted for smaller amounts as did Forest rove. At first the project will rate amounts third to rand Coulee but has the potential of rating second.

I don't expect to set the world on fire on the tour, but it should be a goodpre-holiday buildup.
